## CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS



**COMPUTER CLUB**, Mr. Lynn Avery and Mrs. Sheila Baltzell

The focus of this club is to learn more about computers and software applications through presentations and trips to businesses and colleges that specialize in computers. Membership is open to all. The club meets after school, on the second and fourth Mondays of each month during the school year.

**SCHOLASTIC BOWL**, Mrs. Pat Franzer

This organization is open to all students who wish to compete on an academic level with other local schools. The annual scholastic bowl competition is conducted through Wright State University Lake Campus with many area high schools from northwest and west central Ohio. Participants should be prepared to practice for this activity before and after school hours especially during the months of January through March. The selection process includes teacher recommendations. Interested students should contact the club advisor and listen to the daily morning announcements regarding this activity.

**MATH CLUB**, Math Department Instructors

This informal group meets occasionally throughout the school year to prepare interested students for a variety of mathematics competitions. These include the Ohio Council of Teachers of Mathematics and Mathematics Association of America competitions. Students learn about these opportunities via their individual math instructors. In addition, math teachers and advanced math students assist interested individuals in ACT, SAT and proficiency test preparation as well as tutor those individuals who may need extra assistance in their math studies. Interested students can join this club by contacting a math instructor. Morning announcements inform students regarding membership, meetings, competitions, etc.

**MOCK TRIAL**, Mr. Bill Sell

This co-curricular activity affords the student opportunities to experience the legal system in an in-depth and participatory fashion. Students study and present a legal case in a competition format. Morning announcements alert students to attend an orientation meeting to learn more about this activity.

**JAPANESE SISTER CITY TRIP**, Mr. Bill Sell, Ms. Deb Nutt and Mrs. Jacqui Amstutz

Each year a student and adult group travels to Nandan-Cho, a Japanese sister city, to experience the culture of this country, as well as to maintain the close relationships that have been established with the residents of this community.
