12-34 EXECUTIVE SESSION – O.R.C. §121.22(G)

Mrs. Amy Hoyng introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption: RESOLUTION DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH BOND SSUES AND TAX LEVY.

WHEREAS, this board of education by resolution duly adopted determined the necessity of issuing bonds to pay the local share of school construction project under the State of Ohio Classroom Facilities Assistance Program for a segmented project, including construction of a new PK-3 elementary school building and demolition of East and West Elementary Schools, other improvements to school facilities, including conversion of planned PK-3 to PK-4 building, construction of a high school auditorium and air conditioning for all school buildings, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto, and the necessity of levying an annual direct tax on all the taxable property in this School District, outside of the ten-mill limitation to pay the interest on and to retire said bonds and provided that the question of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax shall be submitted to the electors of said School District at the election to be held on November 6, 2012, as a single proposition together with the question of levying an additional one-half mill tax, outside of the ten mill limitation in compliance with the State of Ohio Classroom Facilities Assistance Program; and

WHEREAS, the board of education has determined that the maximum maturity of said bonds is thirty-three (33) years; and

WHEREAS, the county auditor has certified that the estimated average annual levy throughout the life of said \$27,700,000 school improvement bonds which will be required to pay the interest on and retire said bonds, is three and eight-tenths (3.80) mills, for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation which amounts to thirty-eight cents (\$0.38) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation; and

WHEREAS, the county auditor has certified the total tax valuation of the School District as \$379,852,670; and

WHEREAS, the county auditor also certified \$189,926 as the annual dollar amount to be generated by the proposed one-half mill maintenance levy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Celina City School District (hereinafter called the "Board of Education"), County of Mercer, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the issuance of bonds of this Board of Education under authority of Section 133.18 of the Ohio Revised Code to pay the local share

of school construction under the State of Ohio Classroom Facilities Assistance Program for a segmented project, including construction of a new PK-3 elementary school building and demolition of East and West Elementary Schools, other improvements to school facilities, including conversion of planned PK-3 to PK-4 building, construction of a high school auditorium and air conditioning for all school buildings, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto, and to levy an annual direct tax on all the taxable property in said school district outside of the limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio commencing in 2012, first due in calendar year 2013, and that the question of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax shall be submitted to the electors of said School District at the election to be held on November 6, 2012. SECTION 2. That it is hereby determined to proceed with a levy of taxes in addition to the annual levy of taxes required to repay the bonds, at a rate of one-half mill for each one dollar of valuation and that the question of issuing bonds of the District shall be combined in a single proposal with the question of such tax levy pursuant to Section 3318.056 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That the form of ballot upon which the question of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax and the question of levying said one-half mill maintenance tax shall be submitted to the electors substantially as follows:

Proposed Bond Issue and Tax Levy Majority affirmative vote is Necessary for Passage

"Shall bonds be issued by the Board of Education of the Celina City School District FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE LOCAL SHARE OF SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UNDER THE STATE OF OHIO CLASSROOM FACILITIES ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR A SEGMENTED PROJECT, INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION OF A PK-3 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUILDING DEMOLITION OF EAST AND WEST ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS. **OTHER IMPROVEMENTS** TO SCHOOL FACILITIES. INCLUDING CONVERSION OF PLANNED PK-3 TO PK-4 OF BUILDING, CONSTRUCTION A HIGH SCHOOL AUDITORIUM AND AIR CONDITIONING FOR ALL SCHOOL BUILDINGS, TOGETHER WITH EQUIPMENT, FURNISHINGS, LANDSCAPING AND ALL NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO, in the principal amount of Twenty-Seven Million Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$27,700,000) to be repaid annually over a maximum period of thirty-three (33) years, and an annual levy of property taxes be made outside the ten-mill limitation, estimated by the county auditor to average over the repayment period of the bond issue three and eight-tenths (3.80) mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of tax valuation, which amounts to thirty-eight cents (\$0.38) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of tax valuation, commencing in 2012, first due in calendar year 2013, to pay the annual debt charges on the bonds, and to pay debt charges on any notes issued in anticipation of those bonds?

and

Shall an additional levy of taxes be made for a period of twenty-three years, commencing in 2012, first due in calendar year 2013, to benefit the Celina City School District, the proceeds of which shall be used to pay the cost of maintaining classroom facilities included in the project at the rate of one-half (0.50) mill for each one dollar of valuation?"

FOR THE BOND ISSUE AND TAX LEVY
AGAINST THE BOND ISSUE AND TAX LEVY

SECTION 4. That the treasurer of this Board of Education be and is hereby directed to certify to the Board of Elections a true and correct copy of the resolution of this Board of Education determining the necessity of said bonds, said direct taxes and said election and a true and correct copy of this resolution, together with the amount of the average tax levy, expressed in dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation, as well as in mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, estimated by the county auditor to be required to pay the debt charges on such bonds, and the maximum number of years required to retire said bonds and to notify said board of elections to cause notice of such election to be given as required by law.

SECTION 5. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board of Education; and that all deliberations of this Board of Education and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Mrs. Connie Paulus seconded the motion and the roll being called upon the question of adoption of the resolution, the vote resulted as follows:
