

100th Day of School Project

Dear Parents/Grandparents,

We have been counting the days of school and the 100th day is fast approaching! In fact, it will be February 3rd, if there are no cancellations due to weather. We have kept track of the days using a 100 chart during calendar each day. On the 100th day, we are going to CELEBRATE!

Each child is asked to make a 100 Day project at home and bring it to school by the 3rd. This project must display 100 of something. It can be on a poster, in a box, on a string or whatever you can think of, but it must have 100 of something in it or on it. We have talked about how 10 groups of ten make 100 so it would be easier if your child groups the items in the display by tens.

A few examples I've seen include: 100 pop tabs glued in groups of ten on a poster, colored m&m's glued in groups of tens (10 red, 10 orange, etc.), a giraffe with 100 spots (ten different colors of 10 spots each), 100 stickers (10 balloon stickers, 10 racecar stickers, etc.) 100 pennies - in groups of 10's, a necklace with 100 beads (10 red then 10 blue then 10 green, etc.), 10 pony tails with 10 rubber bands on each one. There are all sorts of items kids have used - pennies, noodles, cars, stickers, cereal, candy, yarn, puffy paint, to name a few.

You have about 2 weeks so encourage your child to take his/her time and be creative. This is a parent/child activity so have fun working together. Your child should be able to count the objects by tens but may need your help in preparing the display. We can't wait to hear your child explain his/her project. If you do get the project done early, send it in any time after January 30th so we can display it in the hallway. Thanks and have fun! Any questions, write me a note!
