Reduced Eligible Students will not be charged for breakfast or lunch this year only.

This school year, 2024-25 families will once again be asked to complete and submit a current school Free/Reduced Application to see if their students qualify based on income. The previous year's status carries over to the first 30 days of the new school year.

Free/Reduced applications will be available at all school offices and online July 1, 2024, and you can also complete a Free/Reduced application on www.payschoolscentral.com. If you currently do not have a Payschools account, you will need to register to set up an account. When you set up your account, you will need to put 20 in front of your child's 6-digit café PIN number. Continue to set up your account to pay lunch, auto replenish lunch account, pay book fees, and complete the Free/Reduced meal application.

Words from the Celina School Guidance Counselors:

We understand that your child comes to Celina Schools with unique experiences, interests, and learning styles. Our goal is to truly know your child well and use this knowledge to guide, support, and motivate him or her. We believe that being a good child advocate requires continual professional development, personal reflection, and collaboration. We value parent involvement at every level and encourage you to partner with Celina Schools to give your child the most powerful and joyous learning experience possible. As school counselors, we work with all students to enhance their academic, career, and social emotional skills. We do this by:

- providing individual, small group, and classroom guidance/ counseling
- working with teachers and parents to provide support for student's needs
- helping to identify academic and social emotional needs of students
- helping students understand themselves and others
- advocating for all students at school
- making referrals to outside agencies
- providing information about community resources and information



What is PBIS? Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) is a proactive approach to establishing the behavioral supports and social culture needed for all students in a school to achieve social, emotional, and academic success. It is a framework that promotes positive behavior through teaching, modeling, and reinforcing appropriate behaviors.

Our 4 Expectations:

1. **Be Responsible:** Taking ownership of one's actions, obligations, and learning.
This includes:
 - Completing assignments and tasks on time.
 - Following classroom and school rules.
 - Being prepared for class with necessary materials.
2. **Be Respectful:** Treating oneself, others, and property with kindness and consideration.
This includes:
 - Using polite language and manners.
 - Respecting differences and diversity.
 - Taking care of school property and belongings.
3. **Be Safe:** Ensuring physical and emotional safety for oneself and others.
This includes:
 - Following safety procedures and rules.
 - Keeping hands, feet, and objects to oneself.
 - Reporting unsafe situations or behaviors.
4. **Be Here:** Being present and engaged in learning and school activities.
This includes:
 - Attending school regularly and punctually.
 - Participating actively in class discussions and activities.
 - Seeking help when needed and contributing positively to the learning environment.

Why PBIS?

- **Promotes Positive School Climate:** PBIS fosters a safe, supportive, and inclusive school environment where all students can thrive.
- **Improves Academic Performance:** By addressing behavior proactively, PBIS helps minimize disruptions and maximize instructional time, leading to improved academic outcomes.
- **Teaches Lifelong Skills:** By reinforcing positive behaviors, PBIS equips students with essential social and emotional skills that are valuable both in and out of school.

How Can You Support PBIS?

- Familiarize yourself with our school's behavior expectations.
- Encourage and model positive behaviors.
- Provide consistent reinforcement and praise for students exhibiting desired behaviors.
- Communicate with school staff about any concerns or suggestions for improving PBIS implementation.

By working together to promote positive behavior and create a supportive school environment, we can ensure the success and well-being of all students. The staff at Celina Schools is dedicated to teaching and reinforcing positive behaviors.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Celina City Schools' Special Education Department strives to continually meet the unique needs of the students it serves in the least restrictive environment. The Special Education Department strives to implement evidence-based strategies leading to high student achievement, high student growth, and fostering and mastery of essential life skills, all while meeting state and federal standards. Our mission is to thoroughly equip and empower our students for life beyond their academic services, whether they aspire towards higher education or seek entry into the world of employment. Celina City Schools is committed to cultivating a spirit of competitiveness and readiness among our students, ensuring they are well-prepared for the many opportunities that await them in life.

Students who qualify for special education are served in the most appropriate Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) to meet their educational needs. Teams consisting of parents, teachers, support staff, and specialists meet regularly to discuss academic progress and behavioral concerns. For students age 14 and older, the teams plan for transition from school to post-secondary options. There are also transitional plans for students exiting preschool and entering kindergarten.

Before being evaluated for Special Education services, students experiencing difficulties in the classroom are referred to the Intervention Assistance Team (IAT) through the Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) process. The team identifies the student's strengths and weaknesses. The team targets the weakness and provides evidence-based strategies to help the student succeed in the general education classroom. If the student does not make adequate progress after being provided intensified instruction in each tier of instruction, the team may refer the student for a Multi-Factored Evaluation (MFE), which results in an Evaluation Team Report (ETR). During the MFE process, the school psychologist and/or other professionals may evaluate the student in areas of ability, academic achievement, and other critical areas that could potentially keep a student from making progress in the general education classroom. If a need is identified and this need requires specially designed instruction, the student may qualify for services from specially trained professionals in their least restrictive environment. An Individual Education Program plan is written. Parents and students are notified of their rights through a procedural safeguard book.

Special Education is funded through Title VI B federal grants along with state and local money. These funds pay for the program's direct teaching services, services provided by outside agencies, supplies, computer software, equipment, mental health services, and other services outlined in an Individualized Education Program (IEP). Please attend the Public Participation meeting scheduled before the September Board of Education Meeting for more detailed information concerning the allocations of Title VI B funds.

Student/Parent Pickup and Drop-off Procedures


Due to ongoing construction, student pickup and drop-off procedures will change at multiple stages during the 2024-2025 school year.

Initial Procedure (Beginning of School Year)

All student pickup and drop-off will occur along the long driveway running from Portland Street to Logan Street. Parents will enter the long drive from Portland Street and exit onto Logan Street (St Rt 29). Parents must pick up or drop off utilizing the right lane (also called the curb lane). Double-stacked parking will not be permitted for the safety of our students. Once your child exits or enters your vehicle, you may utilize the left lane to exit the property. Please see the picture of the Elementary Traffic map below. Please follow these guidelines to ensure a smooth and safe process for everyone. Thank you for your cooperation.

New Elementary Walk Zone

The walk zone for the new elementary school is pictured below. All students living within the blue area: West of Main Street, East of and including Williamsburg Square Apartments, South of Hierholzer Street and Touvelle Street at the curve, North of Logan Street are within the walking zone. Bus stops are still being determined for the areas located outside of the walking zone. More information about bus stops will be shared when it's available.

For those who are new to CMS, I wanted to highlight a few of our major events that take place during the school year starting with a staple experience for all students coming into middle school, which is our 8th grade Washington DC trip. Students will begin fundraising for the trip in 7th grade to help offset the cost when they are preparing for the experience as an 8th grader. This year's trip will take place from April 29 - May 2, 2025.

Another well-known event in middle school is our CMS Mini-Relay for Life that takes place in May. Over the last 20 years, our students and staff have raised over \$330,000.00 for the American Cancer Society. This has become a very special event for our school, and the community as a whole, that allows students to directly contribute to the fight against cancer. 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Celina Middle & High School Transportation Plan 24-25 School Year

With construction taking place, we are asking for parent and student cooperation in order to minimize traffic congestion and ensure safety at Celina High School & Middle School. Please refer to the transportation map in adhering to the following transportation plans:


Middle School Transportation Plan

All buses will be based at Celina Middle School when dropping students off at school in the morning and loading students to go home in the afternoon.

- The CMS parking lot & Holly Street will be closed to parent's dropping-off from 6:40 am and 7:00 am while buses are arriving. After 7:00 am parents can then use the parking lot to drop their students off.
- Middle school bussers will be released at 2:15 pm, everyday, to allow our buses to load and depart by 2:25 pm.
- The CMS parking lot & Holly Street will be closed to parent's picking-up until the buses have departed.
- Non-bus riders will then be dismissed at 2:20 pm.

High School Transportation Plan

- All buses will be based at Celina Middle School when dropping students off in the morning and loading students to go home in the afternoon.
- High school students will walk from CMS to CHS in the morning and will return to CMS to go home in the afternoon on their bus.
- High school bussers will be released at 2:10 pm, everyday, providing them time to walk to the buses located at the middle school.
- High school students being dropped-off in the morning or picked-up in the afternoon will need to do so in the large, east parking lot (formally known as the "Student Parking Lot") at the cafeteria doors. We ask that vehicles drive slowly around the entire parking lot following the white arrows on the transportation map and picking up students near the curb at the cafeteria doors, then moving out to the outside lane to exit.
- Freshmen and Sophomore walkers/car riders are required to stay until 2:20 pm Mondays through Thursdays. Juniors and Seniors in good academic standing are permitted to leave before the Academic Success period at 1:55 pm. All students are dismissed at 1:55 pm on Fridays.
- Student parking will include the west CAPT building parking lot as well as designated spaces closest to the CAPT building in the east parking lot.
- All vehicles exiting the east parking lot will be required to turn right onto Wayne Street to keep traffic progressively moving.
- Visitors are welcome to park in front of the building in the designated "Visitor" parking spaces.

The New Celina High School


Garmann Miller recently produced a series of conceptual renderings of the future Celina High School. The new 202,500 square foot building will serve 7th through 12th grade students and will be located on the existing Celina Primary School and Celina High School campus. The Celina High School renderings show an aerial view of the new school building, a main perspective view from Wayne Street, and an event entrance view that will be on the east side of the new building. Also included are an overall campus site plan and overall building floor plans. These renderings can be seen on the Celina School website under "Bulldog Building Project." After demolition of the existing Celina Primary School building is complete in early summer of 2024, construction of the new Celina High School will begin with site work. The new building is scheduled to be completed in late fall of 2026 / early winter of 2027.
