This meeting is a meeting of the Board of Education in public for the purpose of conducting the School District's business and is not to be considered a public community meeting.

The Celina City Board of Education met in special session on April 30, 2020 at 4:15 p.m. in the Education Complex Auditorium. President Bill Sell called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Huber, Mr. Sell, Mrs. Guingrich, Mr. Gilmore and Mrs. Vorhees answered the roll call.

On a motion by Mr. Gilmore, seconded by Mrs. Vorhees, to approve the resolution requesting the Fiscal Officer to Certify Maximum Maturity of Bonds.

WHEREAS, this Board of Education contemplates the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$69,246,475 to pay the School District's portion of the basic project cost under the State of Ohio Classroom Facilities Assistance Program and locally funded initiatives not exceeding one-half of the School District's portion of the basic project cost (including Celina Intermediate School renovation and addition for grades PK-6; construction of a new 7-12 school building, and the abatement and demolition of the Celina Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, High School and Education Complex), including technology and site improvements, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of Celina City School District (hereinafter called the "Board of Education"), County of Mercer, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Treasurer of this Board of Education, as fiscal officer thereof, is hereby requested to certify to this Board of Education the estimated life of the improvements, assets and/or property to be made and/or acquired with the proceeds of the sale of the bonds referred to in the Preambles hereof and the maximum maturity of said bonds as provided in Section 133.20 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board of Education, and that all deliberations of this Board of Education and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

On a motion by Mr. Gilmore, seconded by Mrs. Vorhees, to approve the Resolution declaring the necessity of a bond issue and tax levy, certifying the same to the County Auditor and Board of Elections, and submitting the question to the electors of the School District.

WHEREAS, this School District intends to participate in the Ohio School Facilities Commission's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education (hereinafter called "Board of Education") of the School District has qualified as a lapsed district to receive assistance from the State of Ohio, under Section 3318.01 to Section 3318.20, inclusive, of the Ohio Revised Code (the "Classroom Facilities Act") by virtue of the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio School Facilities Commission (the "Commission") has determined (and such determination shall be approved by the Controlling Board) the amount of the State's portion of the cost of such classroom facilities (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the provisions of the Program require, in order for the School District to be eligible for State assistance, that the School District pay for its portion of the basic project cost ("Basic Project Cost") as determined pursuant to Section 3318.032 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for this Board of Education to issue approximately \$69,246,475 of bonds (the "Bonds"), which is an amount not less than the School District's portion of basic project costs and the cost of other improvements to school facilities, consisting of locally funded initiatives for the Project; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education proposes to submit to the electors of the entire territory of this School District at the election to be held on the 4th day of August, 2020, the question of issuing bonds of this Board of Education in the amount of \$69,246,475 for the purpose of paying the School District's portion of the basic project cost under the State of Ohio's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program and locally funded initiatives not exceeding one-half of the School District's portion of the basic project cost (including Celina Intermediate School renovation and addition for grades PK-6; construction of a new 7-12 school building, and the abatement and demolition of the Celina Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, High School and Education Complex), including technology and site improvements, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto; and the question of levying an annual direct tax on all of the taxable property in this School District outside of the ten-mill limitation to pay the interest on and to retire said bonds, under authority of Section 133.18 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education has received conditional approval of the Commission for participation in the Program; and

WHEREAS, this School District desires to proceed with the Project; and construction of the additional improvements, to protect the health and safety of its students; and

WHEREAS, it is unable, by issuing bonds in an amount equal to the School District's portion of Basic Project Cost, to provide adequate classroom facilities without assistance from the State, and in order to qualify for such State assistance, it is necessary to levy taxes outside the limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII, Ohio Constitution to pay the interest on and to retire Bonds to pay the School District's portion of basic project cost and the cost of other improvements to school facilities, consisting of locally funded initiatives for the Project, and to provide an

additional one-half mill maintenance levy for the purpose of maintaining or upgrading the classroom facilities included in the Project, under the State of Ohio Classroom Facilities Assistance Program, and that the question of such Bond issue and tax levies shall be submitted to the electors of the entire territory of the Celina City School District at the election to be held August 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 3318.05 and 3318.06, it is necessary that the rate which is necessary to be levied for an additional tax apart from the tax needed to pay debt service on the Bonds shall be not less than one-half mill for each one dollar of valuation and that such tax shall be levied for a period of twenty-three (23) years; and

WHEREAS, the questions of issuing the Bonds and levying a tax for maintenance as required by the Program shall be combined as one ballot issue pursuant to and as authorized by Section 3318.056 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education desires to adopt a resolution declaring the necessity of said Bond issue, said direct taxes and said election; and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer of this Board of Education has certified the maximum maturity of the Bonds to be thirty-eight (38) years.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Celina City School District, County of Mercer, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That it is necessary to issue Bonds of this Board of Education in the principal amount of \$69,246,475 for the purpose described in the Preambles hereof. Said amount shall be spent in compliance with Ohio Revised Code Section 133.06 (I). Said Bonds shall be dated approximately November 1, 2020, shall bear interest at the rate now estimated at four percent (4%) per annum, and shall mature in substantially equal annual or semiannual installments over a period not exceeding thirty-eight (38) years after their issuance.

SECTION 2. That it is necessary that there shall be annually levied on all of the taxable property of the entire territory of this School District, a direct tax outside the limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to pay the interest on and to retire said Bonds. Said tax shall be first levied in tax year 2020 and first collected in calendar year 2021.

SECTION 3. That the question of issuing said Bonds and of levying said direct tax shall be submitted to the electors of the entire territory of this School District at the election to be held on the 4th day of August, 2020, pursuant to Section 133.18 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4. That the question of an additional levy of taxes, apart from the tax needed to pay debt service on the Bonds, for a period of twenty-three (23) years to benefit the Celina City School District, the proceeds of which shall be used to pay the cost of maintaining or upgrading the classroom facilities included in the Project, at the rate of one-half mill for each one dollar valuation, for a period of twenty-three (23) years, shall also be submitted to the electors of the entire territory of this School District as hereinafter provided. Said tax shall also be first levied in tax year 2020 and first collected in calendar year 2021. The question of issuing Bonds shall be combined in a single proposal with the question of such tax levy pursuant to Section 3318.056 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. That the Treasurer of this Board of Education be and is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the Mercer County Auditor for the determination of total current assessed value and calculation of the average annual levy that will be required to pay the interest on and retire said Bonds and the dollar amount of revenue generated by the one-half mill maintenance levy pursuant to Section 5705.03 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board of Education concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board of Education; and that all deliberations of this Board of Education and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

# CELINA CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES EDUCATION COMPLEX AUDITORIUM TUESDAY, MAY 5, 2020 12:00 P.M.

This meeting is a meeting of the Board of Education in public for the purpose of conducting the School District's business and is not to be considered a public community meeting.

The Celina City Board of Education met in special session on May 5, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. in the Education Complex Auditorium. President Bill Sell called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Huber, Mr. Sell, Mrs. Guingrich, Mr. Gilmore and Mrs. Vorhees answered the roll call.

Mr. Metz updated the Board about potential graduation plans. Possibly wait until July dependent upon restrictions or also planning for a drive-thru ceremony.

Jen Fleming, Chairperson of the Levy Committee, spoke to the Board about the potential for an August ballot issue, asking the Board to put it into the hands of the voters.

On a motion by Mr. Gilmore, seconded by Mrs. Guingrich, to approve the resolution determining to proceed with a bond issue and tax levy for purposes of an OFCC building project.

Each member spoke about the levy issue. All members are ultimately supportive of the building project; however several felt that due to the timing surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic it was in the best interest to postpone putting this before the voters until possibly November.

WHEREAS, this Board of Education by resolution duly adopted on April 30, 2020 determined: (1) the necessity of issuing bonds in the amount of \$69,246,475, for the purpose of paying the School District's portion of the basic project cost under the State of Ohio's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program and locally funded initiatives not exceeding one-half of the School District's portion of the basic project cost (including Celina Intermediate School renovation and addition for grades PK-6; construction of a new 7-12 school building, and the abatement and demolition of the Celina Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, High School and Education Complex), including technology and site improvements, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto; and the necessity of levying an annual direct tax on all the taxable property in this School District, outside of the ten-mill limitation to pay the interest on and to retire said bonds and provided that the question of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax shall be submitted to the electors of said School District at the election to be held on August 4, 2020, and (2) the necessity of levying an additional tax levy for the purpose of paying the cost of maintaining or upgrading the classroom facilities included in the project at the rate of one-half (0.50) mill for each one dollar of valuation, commencing in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021, for a period of twenty-three (23) years; and

WHEREAS, the Treasurer of this Board of Education has certified that the maximum maturity of said bonds is thirty-eight (38) years; and

WHEREAS, the Mercer County Auditor has certified the total tax valuation of the School District, the estimated millage required for debt charges on the bonds and has estimated the annual property tax revenue to be produced annually by the proposed maintenance levy; and

WHEREAS, the Mercer County Auditor has certified that the estimated average annual levy throughout the life of said bonds which will be required to pay the interest on and retire said bonds, is seven and four-tenths (7.4) mills, for each one dollar (\$1.00) valuation which amounts to seventy-four cents (\$0.74) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation; and

WHEREAS, this Board by resolution duly adopted intends to submit to the electors of the School District at the election to be held on August 4, 2020, the question of an additional levy of taxes for twenty-three (23) years for maintaining or upgrading classroom facilities of the School District.

WHEREAS, the question of issuing bonds of the School District shall be combined in a single proposal with the question of such tax levy for maintenance as authorized by Section 3318.056 of the Ohio Revised Code (the "Authorizing Legislation").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Celina City School District (hereinafter called the "Board of Education"), County of Mercer, Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the amount of taxes that can be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the present and future requirements of the School District.

SECTION 2. That it is necessary to issue general obligation bonds of the School District for the purpose of paying the School District's portion of the basic project cost under the State of Ohio's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program and locally funded initiatives not exceeding one-half of the School District's portion of the basic project cost (including Celina Intermediate School renovation and addition for grades PK-6; construction of a new 7-12 school building, and the abatement and demolition of the Celina Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, High School and Education Complex), including technology and site improvements, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto, and to levy an additional tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation to pay debt charges on the bonds and any anticipatory securities, to be first levied in 2020, first due in calendar year 2021.

SECTION 3. That is necessary for twenty-three (23) years to levy additional taxes in excess of the ten-mill limitation to pay for the cost of maintaining or upgrading the classroom facilities included in the project.

SECTION 4. That the question of the bonds and taxes shall be submitted to the electors of the School District at the election to be held on August 4, 2020, which shall not be earlier than ninety (90) days after certification of this resolution to the Mercer County Board of Elections.

SECTION 5. That it is hereby determined necessary to proceed with the issuance of bonds of this Board of Education in the amount of \$69,246,475, for the purpose stated herein, and to levy an annual direct tax on all the taxable property in said School District outside of the limitation imposed by Section 2 of Article XII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to pay debt charges on the bonds and any anticipatory securities, and that the question of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax shall be submitted to the electors of said School District at the election to be held on August 4, 2020, under authority of the Authorizing Legislation.

SECTION 6. That the Treasurer of this Board of Education be and is hereby directed to certify to the Board of Elections a true and correct copy of the resolution of this Board of Education determining the necessity of said bonds, said direct taxes and said election and a true and correct copy of this resolution, together with the amount of the average tax levy, expressed in dollars and cents for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of valuation as well as in mills for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, and the amount of revenue that would be generated by the one-half mill maintenance levy, both as estimated by the Mercer County Auditor, and the maximum number of years required to retire said bonds and to notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of such election to be given as required by law.

SECTION 7. That it is hereby determined necessary to proceed with a levy of taxes as specified in the Authorizing Legislation at a rate of one-half (0.50) mill for each one dollar of valuation for project maintenance, for twenty-three (23) years, to be first levied in 2020, collection year 2021, and that the question of issuing bonds of the School District shall be combined in a single proposal, with the question of such maintenance tax levy.

SECTION 8. That the form of ballot upon which the questions of issuing said bonds and of levying said direct tax and the maintenance direct tax shall be submitted to the electors substantially as follows:

(1) Issue bonds for the purpose of paying the School District's portion of the basic project cost under the State of Ohio's Classroom Facilities Assistance Program and locally funded initiatives not exceeding one-half of the School District's portion of the basic project cost (including Celina Intermediate School renovation and addition for grades PK-6; construction of a new 7-12 school building, and the abatement and demolition of the Celina Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, High School and Education Complex), including technology and site improvements, together with equipment, furnishings, landscaping and all necessary appurtenances thereto, in the principal amount of \$69,246,475 to be repaid annually over a maximum period of thirty-eight (38) years, and levy a property tax outside the ten mill limitation, estimated by the County Auditor to average over the bond repayment period seven and four-tenths (7.4) mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, which amounts to seventy-four cents (\$0.74) for each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of tax valuation, to pay the annual debt charges on the bonds, and to pay debt charges on any notes issued in anticipation of those bonds?
