RE: District Information and Plan Development for Student Wellness and Success Funds and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid

Ohio Law requires districts and schools to develop a plan outlining how they will use Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid and Student Wellness and Success Funds. The plan includes how the funds will be used in coordination with community partners. Districts and schools may use the Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) as a framework to develop a comprehensive plan for spending funds that outlines goals, strategies and partnerships required to meet expected outcomes.

Describe Use of Funds:

The funds generated from the Student Wellness and Success Funds and the Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid will be used to meet the needs of our students by offering ELL services and mental health services in the form of school psychologists, a social worker, counselors and nurses. We will also meet the needs of our struggling learners by offering the services of a literacy coach and alternatives to dropping out.

Coordination with Community Partners:

Celina City Schools work closely with Foundations Behavioral Health Services to provide mental health counselors in the buildings. Students are recommended by our school administrators and counselors to receive services from the Foundations counselors. The school also works closely with the Mercer County Educational Service Center to provide alternatives to drop out in the form of the Community Learning Center and Rose Academy.

Impact of Funds:

Celina School District enrollment is about 2400 students. All 2400 students could potentially be impacted using these funds. Mental Health concerns continue to rise, and awareness provided to our staff members is critical in meeting our students' needs.
